THOUGHTS FROM PRINCIPAL HENDERSON

The Haitian creole expression “ou fom” has been on my heart a great deal over recent months. After I share some thoughts about the past month, I will explain why “ou fom” relates to recent months, Kids Against Hunger, and life in Haiti.

We can't begin February without reflecting on January. It was a month... We battled through a flurry of Covid cases and quarantines. Yet, we rolled with the punches and kept it moving. Our kids flexed and adapted, while our teachers led the way once again, having to go split screen at times, with numerous students learning virtually while most of the class was learning in person. Our staff has also been hit in waves with their own personal and family challenges

with Covid, yet everyone has persevered, supported one another, and flexed to keep our kids learning in person. You are blessed to have a staff that loves Jesus, loves your kids, and is living out James 1:12.

I am inspired that your children have godly examples who are pouring into them daily, challenging them, teaching them, loving them, guiding them, and inspiring them. Our staff is continually learning, collaborating, and looking for ways to positively impact your children. They also went to crazy lengths to help inspire your students to raise money for our Kids Against Hunger event. Kids Against Hunger was a powerful event for students and staff alike and we were so blessed to have an opportunity to live out Christ's

call to serve Him and love others. In addition to the tangible ways our students were able to serve others, it also created opportunities for our students to grow in their faith, give personally, and witness the Lord's faithfulness when we trust Him.

"Ou fom?" (pronounced oo - foam)

It's a question asked along the paths, streets and roads of Haiti all day long. "Ou fom" translates to "you strong? or are you being strong?" A few years ago, a friend and I thought it would be a great idea to hike over the mountains from Baie D' Orange, Belle Anse, Haiti, to the village of Kenscoff to trace the steps of the women who travel to market with their goods to sell so they can purchase items they need at market and buy others to sell at their local market. Kenscoff is one of the highest points in Haiti and also the place where my daughters' crèche was located during our seemingly unending adoption process.

The people from Grand Ravine, which is in northern Baie D' Orange, say it is an hour from their village until you can see Kenscoff. I can tell you I saw nothing resembling Kenscoff after an hour. When we were finally able to see something across many mountain peaks that might resemble Kenscoff and asked where it was, a local farmer, who was our guide, laughed and waved his hand, reflecting the fact that it was up and over anything we could see in the nearby mountains. There were many times along the journey when I felt like the kid in the back seat of the car along a long journey constantly wondering, "Are we almost there?" and "How much longer?" Every time we went over one mountain peak, we went down another only to climb another and descend again and again and again. I lost track of how many times we went up and down, but I know that every step of the way the view was absolutely amazing. I was surrounded by some of the most beautiful scenery I've ever encountered.

Rugged mountain peaks jutted in every direction. The mountainsides were an amazing display of the most determined farming I've ever seen. On mountainsides that were seemingly impossible to climb or even stand on, farmers had planted an array of crops. I'm in awe of their ability to farm seemingly impossible slopes that are ridiculously treacherous. It is yet another perspective on the brutal challenges facing the Haitian people. They battle and persevere just to survive. Survival...

Our guide was a local farmer from Baie D' Orange who we had met the day before. He offered to show us the way. He took his entire day to show us the way and give us an amazing perspective on another aspect of Haitian life. Until you've walked in their steps, it's nearly impossible to fully grasp some of the brutal realities of their lives. Our guide taught us about life in his community and shared his story and his heart that he wants an education for himself and the children in his community. The nearest school is a walk of at least four hours. He was eager to learn. He was using

farming methods he learned from watching other farmers, but he wanted a chance to do better. They farm crops that only produce six months out of the year, which often leads to brutal malnutrition the other six months of the year. This region usually experiences the worst malnutrition in the poorest country in the Western Hemisphere. They constantly battle erosion and the loss of soil, which results from horrible deforestation and brutal tropical storms.

When the farmers do harvest their crops, the women carry their goods on their heads all the way to market. Up one mountain peak, down the backside, up another and down again, over and over again and again and again. They leave at one in the morning to journey in the dark across brutal roads and paths, with loose rocks along those steep paths, so they can get to a filthy market, sit all day, earning a paltry sum, so they can purchase some additional goods needed for their families and also to see at their local markets and return home again along the same brutal route. I was carrying a forty-pound backpack that felt like seventy-five at times. It gave us a slight window into their reality as it ultimately took us 8 hours to complete our journey. While we were exhausted and often discouraged, when we would see yet another brutal stretch of path awaiting us to get up another mountain, wondering when we would ever get there, it didn't take much to remind us that this is what they do on a daily basis. Life in Haiti...

It's not a hike, it's not a one-time challenge, it's daily survival. Along the way we often heard. "Ou fom?" We always answered yes, but each time it made me reflect on the very question and the frequency that it's asked. It is a question, but it's really a reminder for their brothers and sisters to hold tough, to be strong and to press on even when the mountains seem insurmountable and the challenges are overwhelming. It's asked at times when they have nothing to feed their precious, beautiful children. It's asked at times when their crops are devastated by tropical storms and they don't know where to turn. Is "Ou fom" the mantra that enables them to press on even when it might be easier to give up?

Throughout the past couple of years, just when it seems we've climbed the mountain, we are faced with another challenge, and then another, and then...

While these challenges can seem never ending and frustrating, we must keep our eyes on the Lord and reflect on the reality that our challenges could be so much greater. We will continue to broaden our students' perspectives to the realities of this world and create opportunities to serve others and impact the world for Christ. Thank you for partnering with us along this journey. "Ou fom?"

FRESHMEN NEWS

SOPHOMORE NEWS

The PSAT 10 is scheduled to be given to the Class of 2024 here at school on Tuesday, March 22. This is a practice/preliminary SAT test for sophomores in preparation for the official SAT test given at CCHS to juniors.

ACT and SAT TEST DATES

Juniors planning on going to college are encouraged to take both the ACT and SAT at least once. A total of 3-4 tests is recommended in most cases for maximizing scores and merit scholarships. College-bound students should use Focus Periods to practice for the SAT and/or ACT through their Khan Academy accounts.

The Class of 2023 is signed up to take the SAT at school the morning of Wednesday, March 23.

The ACT can be taken April 2, June 11, or July 16. CCHS is a testing site for the June 11 test. Please visit www.act.org to register.

The SAT can be taken – in addition to March 23 – on March 12, May 7, and June 4. Please visit collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/sat/register to register.

SENIOR NEWS

FINANCIAL AID for COLLEGE-BOUND SENIORS

Many of seniors are anxiously waiting to hear about acceptance and/or financial aid offers. A very important component of financial aid from colleges is need-based aid, determined through the Free Application for Feral Student Aid (FAFSA). Once you have completed the FAFSA, you simply wait for the financial aid reports. **Make sure to complete the FAFSA by March 1.**

Each college will send a financial aid award letter listing the financial aid they will award to you if you come to their school.

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

College-bound seniors are strongly encouraged to apply for additional scholarships beyond merit scholarships and need-based aid through the FAFSA. These additional scholarships are often called “Named” or “Donor-funded” scholarships. They can be available through a specific college or through other organizations. Deadlines are approaching! 2022-23 ADVANCED PLACEMENT CLASSES

Advanced Placement Government, Calculus, and Physics will again be offered for the 2021-22 school year. These AP courses are taught at the college level with college level materials. Students will be expected to take an AP examination upon completion of the course. Most colleges and universities will grant college credit if a student meets their score requirement. These courses can be used for Calvin Christian High School credit in Government (.5), Calculus (1.0), and Physics (1.0) in addition to the potential college credit.
