

COLLEGE VISIT INFORMATION

Students are encouraged to make several college visits during their high school career. These visits help the student experience different campuses and help them make an informed decision about where they would like to go. Visits can be made during summer travel, during high school breaks, or during the school year as an excused absence.

Types of Visits

Individual

- Usually during the summer or when organized visit days are not offered
- Include personal attention and can be tailored to your personal interest

Quick Tours

- Often consist of a meeting with admissions counselors and a campus tour
- Usually given in a group setting and lasts 2-3 hours

Full Day Visits

- May involve group meetings, campus tour, lunch on campus, entertainment, and student panels
- May provide an opportunity to sit in on a class and/or speak to a professor in your chosen major

Overnight Visits

- Generally involve the “Full Day Visit” activities along with a stay in a host student’s dorm room
- Gives most opportunity to ask students questions (why they chose this college, what they like and don’t like, what they do on weekends, etc.)

Specifics in Scheduling

Set up visits through your chosen college. Links to visit registration are usually available on the “admission” or “incoming freshmen” pages.

Parents are invited! Many colleges offer information meetings geared specifically for parents.

One CCHS excused absence college visit is allowed during the school year. Forms are available in the office and they must be completed three days in advance. Extra CCHS college visit days may be acquired in exchange for a Personal Day or Family Vacation Days.
